The "Coach Approach" to Performance Management (1-day)

Course Description A manager's role in the most innovative, engaging, and productive organizations, is that of "coach" - someone who enables a culture where performance management is an on-going professional development practice throughout the year, rather than just an annual appraisal event. This workshop focuses on the "coach approach" to performance management, and will build skills that lead to conversations employees welcome, and that inspire their best work. In this workshop, participants will explore the core coaching competencies and how to set the foundation for powerful coaching conversations built on trust and effective communication. There will be several interactive exercises in this workshop designed to build skills, practice applying the concepts, and create action plans. Participants will discover how to make coaching a habit that drives employee performance.

Lean Process Improvement (1-Day)

Course Description:

Every organization is a collection of processes. These processes are the natural business activities you perform that produce value, serve customers and generate results. Many organizations follow dated policies and procedures because of the tradition. Process improvement techniques can greatly increase productivity and efficiency and/or reduce the cost of operations by eliminating waste and nonvalue added steps and uncovering the root causes of systematic quality issues.

Learning Objectives:

- Manage/communicate a process improvement
- Create "current state" and "future state" process
- Identify and reduce non-value added steps (Waste) Apply Lean tools/methodologies (Value-Stream Map, Waste Walk, A3 Thinking)
- Create an Action Plan to track and drive improvement efforts

Course Description: Today's higher education environment is confronted with challenges and forces for change that are rapid and constant. How "change ready" is your university and how effective are your change initiatives? Successful organizational change requires that individuals embrace change and strategic initiatives more quickly and effectively, and adopt new technology with less productivity impact. Establishing change management methods and strategies reduces risk, cuts costs and significantly improves business outcomes. Many higher education institutions are successfully building change management capability using the Prosci ADKAR Model, providing best practices, skills and tools to senior executives, faculty, middle managers and staff.

Data Visualization and Predictive Analytics for Business Officers (3-day)

modifications.

Colleges and universities are increasingly reliant on data to make decisions and solve problems. As a result, business officers need to know how to search for and utilize key metrics that identify and solve problems. This workshop shows you how to explore your data for insights and actionable metrics; and turn those metrics into actionable solutions using data visualization. We will cover principles of data exploration (i.e. data mining), data creation in Tableau, and principles for presenting data to top level administrators. You will have time and guidance to experiment with these techniques. Predictive analytics is a phrase that litters the news, but one too many business officers have little experience with. We often hear about predictive analytics and data mining technologies being applied to enrollment and retention problems, but it may not be immediately obvious how the business and finance parts of an institution can use these technologies. The session will cover the full life cycle of a project, from idea to implementation and assessment and then how to identify and select metrics; how to know your data; and how to build dashboards that tell compelling stories. No prior knowledge will be assumed, although a basic understanding of statistics is helpful. We will use RapidMiner Free, an industry-leading data mining tool that requires no programming skills. You will need to bring a laptop for this hands-on workshop.

- Understand principles for using data to brief senior leadership
- Understand the terminology and tools involved in predictive analytics, data mining, and other advanced analytic techniques
- Learn a repeatable process for advanced analytics that can be applied to a variety of business problems
- Practice assessing the results of an analysis to determine next steps

Who Should Attend:

This workshop is intended for individuals at all levels of the organization who are responsible for complex analysis. Experienced professionals involved in strategic questions at either the college or institution level, in any department interested in learning how data visualizations can help their organization make decisions, advocate for change, and show results.
